#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This 5-week online course is designed for CNU graduate students new to academic writing. This course aims to introduce students to academic writing and prepare them for the expectations of college-level writing. Throughout the course, students will develop fundamental skills in academic writing, including but not limited to

- identifying academic and non-academic registers,
- forming grammatically correct sentences,
- constructing effective paragraphs,
- developing full essays, and
- self-editing their work.

Overall, this course will provide students with a strong foundation in academic writing, enabling them to write effectively and confidently in their academic and professional pursuits.
